In the current context of networked enterprises, the industrial management becomes more and more complex with many cultures, many different practices, and many heterogeneous systems.

In order to control, maintain and improve such enterprise networks in their manufacturing activity, decision makers need performance measurement at the global level of the network as well as at the local level of each enterprise. For instance, implementation of robust and meaningful performance measures across chains of organizations is even a more complicated task that we do not know enough about.

The aim of this track is to present recent results concerning the Supply Chain Performance modeling and evaluation, particularly in its processing step, and to provide experts in that field with an opportunity to exchange information and discuss new developments in this sense.

Topics

The topics to this invited track are include but are not restricted to:

- Performance measurement systems for SCM
- SC performance formalization
- SC modeling
- Bullwhip effect impact on the overall SC performance
- Supplier Performance management
- Service SC performance measurement
- Standards and reference models for SC performance measurement
- Risk and uncertainty measurement and management in SC

Submission

The special track encourages not only formal academic papers, but also scientific contributions describing real case studies in the field of SC.

Submitted papers (6 pages in IFAC double column format) will be reviewed by at least two referees. Both academic and industrial oriented communications will be considered. All papers accepted for presentation will appear in the Preprints of the symposium and will be distributed to the participants. Papers duly presented at the Symposium will be archived in the form of Proceedings published at IFAC-PapersOnline.net by Elsevier. Further submission instructions as well as submission are handled by the IFAC website http://ifac.papercept.net/. Several international journals are associated with the symposium for publication of special issues.
